Radio Ikhlas	This is a local radio station broadcasting 24 hrs 7 days a week. This project will employ a part-time youth worker to offer media skills opportunities. This will motivate young people to volunteer, working closely with voluntary organisations, to access training in a range of presentation/technical/admin roles, to enhance their employability. Young people aged 15-19, both female & male from the Pakistani/Bangladeshi/Somali/Arab/Indian/Bosnian communities will be involved in the project.	£14,480.00
Derbyshire Constabulary	The project is to combine the energy and creativity of Derby communities to create a giant canvas to celebrate children and young people and trans-generational working, to be exhibited at an event in the market place during Derby Feste. The artwork will be created through public workshops run by artists at Quad and University of Derby students. The project aims to increase the confidence and creative skills of young people aged 10 to 19 from all communities in Derby.	£6,778.00
Martha's Oasis	This community group focuses on the health and wellbeing of women. This project is to provide a 'Me Story' project which comprises the key elements of the 'Sisters with Voices' - seven week development programme condensed into a programme over three weekends and one residential. The project will recruit 14 girls aged 14-17 from local schools and organisations from inner city Derby at risk of underachievement. Volunteer mentors will explore their 'stories' and aim to raise their aspirations, through group work and activities.	£4,963.00
Enthusiasm Youth Charity	This is a charity that aims to see young people fulfil their true potential in life by diverting them from crime, building self esteem, raising aspiration. The project is to deliver a series of workshops and events for 14 – 18 year olds throughout the summer holidays. The workshops will focus on issues of sexual health, body image, self esteem, employability and teamwork, hopes and aspirations, community and citizenship, victims and justice and budgeting and will use a range of delivery methods including dance/drama workshops, trips/visits, music/lyric writing and practical challenge tasks. Young people will gain new skills in speaking/listening, ICT, time management and organisations skills.	£4,900.00
Film City	This voluntary organisation works with a variety of schools and community organisations to develop training programmes and working experiences in new media and digital media productions. The project will run a media training project for young people aged 10 to 19 in Normanton that will create a series of short documentaries exploring careers in the creative industries in Derby. The films will be available online as pod casts and as part of a community media archive available to other young people. The project will provide a range of opportunities for young people to gain new skills/work experience in digital media production working alongside industry professionals, project leadership and management, research into jobs and careers, networking, advice and guidance from creative professionals.	£4,750.00
Children and Young People's Network	This voluntary sector group provides a forum for voluntary and community organisations working with children and young people within Derby. The project will engage 100 disadvantaged young people across the city, in particular young carers and young people from BME communities, in consultation sessions, supported by Connexions and a project worker. From the consultation, events will be planned around these themes to help young people to focus on their aspirations and provide information and guidance on how to realise their ambitions.	£9,450.00
Young Enterprise East Midlands - Learn to Earn	Young Enterprise East Midlands is a business education charity and this project will deliver the Learn to Earn programme to all young people in year 9 in Bemrose, Noel Baker, Merrill, Da Vinci and Sinfin secondary schools. The project will be delivered in partnership with trained volunteers from local businesses who through practical activities help students to understand the links between education and future success and inform subject choices.	£9,150.00
Groundwork Derby and Derbyshire	This voluntary sector organisation aims to promote the conservation, protection and improvement of the physical and natural environment. This project would support young people in Alvaston to develop a derelict piece of land into a community allotment. Three action days would be planned to create four raised beds, install a water butt and compost bins. Basic food growing sessions would be delivered so the group could start growing their own food.	£4,468.00
Young Enterprise	Young Enterprise East Midlands is a business education charity and this project will	£10,000.00

East Midlands - Business Learning	provide a business learning programme for targeted secondary schools in Derby. Students aged 15-19 years will have an opportunity to set up and run a real business for one year and take part in a competition at a local and national level, supported by local business people. Statistical evidence supports the positive outcomes achieved by the programme including higher earnings, career success, and numbers starting businesses.	
Derby City Council Libraries	The project would create a community web resource that would act as a digital archive of the memories of Derby residents with the first focus of the project being sport linked to the Cultural Olympiad. Young people would be recruited through agencies including Community Action, NACRO and Extended Schools and trained and encouraged to record their own, and other people's, experience of sporting events in and around Derby. Young people 10-19 years will gain skills in questioning, listening and editing and supported by Living Derby to undertake research to put the information into historical and local context and publish on a website. Sessions on careers in the creative industries will be included.	£17,000.00
The Kingsmead School	Kingsmead School supports young people in Derby that struggle in mainstream school, they may have been permanently excluded from school and need specialist support to help them achieve and succeed. Junction 16 is a project based at the school that offers a mentor service and personalised learning for KS4 students. The project plans to enhance the provision to the students by planning a careers event, college visits and open days to raise the aspirations of the students.	£8,000.00
ECHO Sinfin	ECHO is a voluntary organisation based in Sinfin that aims to empower marginalised young people to develop and manage projects and activities themselves in their local area. The project would initially provide informal workshops to identify how young people can get involved in training volunteering and skills development. Success! Workshops will be run in partnership with local businesses to inspire young people and provide work placements. Training courses will be provided to engage young people in accredited qualifications.	£4,973.00
NHS Derby City	The project will work with young women and young parents to provide an opportunity for them to meet other young people and raise their aspirations. Sessions will include health related activities and advice but the overall aim of the project is to produce a book to cover parenting, looking after baby, nutrition, relationships, money, education, training etc. Young people will gain skills in writing, design and photography that will increase confidence, self esteem and ambition.	£4,662.00
Jobs, Education and Training	This organisation aims to reduce social deprivation, to deliver jobs education and training and to improve economic prosperity throughout the community. The project will work with young people in school year six and their parents in Normanton, Arboretum, Abbey and Sinfin to provide additional classes in a range of subjects including English/Maths, drama, homework clubs and games. The aim is to increase skills, ambition and attainment in local schools. The project will be supported by University of Derby final year teaching students.	£15,000.00
Normanton Young Peoples Diversionary Project	The organisation is a community group that aims to tackle youth inclusion, antisocial behaviour and increase personal achievement. The project is to run street sports sessions in Normanton in partnership with the CSP and the Neighbourhood Manager. Weekly cricket sessions will be offered in partnership with DCC Pakistani Youth Project and deliver a 10 week leadership course to year 6 pupils in Normanton and Sinfin. The project will also work in partnership with extended schools and sports partnership.	£4,249.00
Rolls Royce Cricket Club	This voluntary organisation offers opportunities for people from the inner-city to engage in cricket and multi sports. The project will run weekly indoor cricket sessions for two hours each at Sinfin Community Schools for two age groups: 10 – 13 and 14 – 19 and will involve bringing in specialist coaches to develop skills and put three young people through a coaching qualification. These activities will take place in Sinfin and Normanton and work in partnership with School Sport Partnership. Young people will gain new social skills around communication, team work and leadership.	£4,463.00
The Industrial Trust	This organisation is a charity that aims to inspire, educate and inform young people. The project is to work with the secondary and feeder schools in the target wards of Abbey, Alvaston, Arboretum, Boulton, Derwent, Mackworth, Normanton and Sinfin to offer young people, aged 10 to 19 educational visits into a working environment locally.	£7,232.00

	The aim is to inspire young people to see the relevance of classroom learning as a way to achieve their ambitions for work.	
Derby Community Safety Partnership - CSP	This project would fund a range of activities across 12 wards within Derby. Young people would be involved in a range of projects including; environmental projects in Sinfin, Osmaston, Blagreaves, Littleover and Mickleover to develop horticultural skills to improve the area. Wildlife and conservation projects in Abbey where young people will gain an award, an art and garden project at Mackworth Library, inspiring young people in Darley and Allestree through the University of Derby and garden makeover projects in Derwent, Chaddesden, Spondon and Oakwood.	£12,977.00
Deda	This voluntary sector organisation operates a dance academy for children 0 - 19 years which includes dance classes and dance performances. This project would support the Take the Floor/Big Dance event by offering activities around the Adizones in Derby. The Adizones are outdoor gym, exercise and performance spaces. A Parkour/breakdance artist would work with the young people to generate materials that would be presented and performed at Take the Floor.	£3,500.00
Derby Racial Equality Council	This charity aims to work towards the elimination of racial discrimination and to promote equality of opportunity and good relations. A part-time young person will be employed as a Youth Human Rights Project Worker who will be supported to recruit and train 20 young people on the Council of Europe Human Rights Education Manual. They will then become Peer Human Rights Educators able to deliver workshops to other young people. The 20 will also be assistant co-ordinators of the Derby Equality and Human Rights Youth Network. They will be trained to defuse conflicts in schools and community settings. The project will be targeted at Derby Moor, West Park and St Benedicts schools and youth clubs in Normanton, Arboretum, Sinfin and Littleover.	£13,644.00
Community Soccer Stars UK	This community group aims to deliver a range of programmes and initiatives using football, physical activity and sports leadership for children, young people and families. The project will run World Cup activity events at 6 targeted schools. Each group is given a world cup country and pupils are assigned roles like coach, nutritionist, kit designer, journalist and planner and they have activities to do and decisions to take within the group. They get points for this which count towards a football tournament in the afternoon. There will be 4 expert coaches at each event. The project will increase confidence and give pupils the chance to experience the skills needed for different roles.	£5,000.00
Surtal Asian Arts	This is a voluntary arts organisation based in Derby, whose activities include dance and music workshops, literature development, exhibition and performance programmes. The project "Rhythm of the World" aims to engage young people in performing arts activities. Young people would work with dance choreographers, musicians and composers to explore cross cultural music and dance styles. Young people would also attend and perform at a number of festivals. Wards targeted include Arboretum, Alvaston, Normanton, Littleover and Sinfin.	£9,700.00
Sinfonia ViVA Orchestra	Sinfonia ViVA is a classical chamber orchestra based in Derby. The project will provide an opportunity for young people from disadvantaged communities to engage in a music project. Workshops would be planned and young people would create their own work that would eventually be performed at the Assembly Rooms. Anna Meredith, an international composer, would be supporting the project.	£5,000.00
Derby County in the Community	The organisation is a charity that aims to ensure that children and young people can access high quality football. The project is to set up a new Kickz programme in Normanton and Arboretum, running three sessions/week for 40 weeks aimed at young people, male and female, aged 12 to 19 years who are referred by agencies as being at risk of not progressing into further education, training or work. Two football and one alternative activity session to link in aspects such as gun crime and sexual health. A steering group will be established to involve young people in the management of the project.	£19,700.00
Sporting Futures	This is a charity that works with disadvantaged young people in Derbyshire. The project would deliver a programme of diversionary and educational opportunities for young people living in areas around the Adizone sites in the Derby. Adizones are outdoor gym, exercise and performance spaces. Young people will be trained as sport leaders to help sustain the project.	£6,015.00

Family Action Derby	This charity works with vulnerable families building on their strengths, supporting them to fulfil their potential and make a positive contribution to their community. The project is to hold dance sessions at the St James' Centre. Young people would be encouraged to take part in organising activities, refreshments, choreography and planning a celebration event. Young people 15-19 years, male and female, and from the Czech, Polish and Roma communities would be targeted for the dance project and will also have an opportunity for a work experience placement in a voluntary organisation.	£5,000.00
