

Play Safe, Play Free Project - This project will provide a core Play Ranger service across the city, which will be enhanced by a mobile climbing wall. As the first of its kind in Derby, this project will challenge the view of what play should be like.

Water Play for All Project - This project will provide a new, unique, innovative, interactive and inclusive water play facility in an important City park. Chaddesden Park is one of the city's largest parks, serving the north east of the city and a population of approximately 52,000.

Reach Out and Play Project - This project will provide inclusive play provision and opportunities for children and young people in Derby who are disabled, have additional needs, are profoundly disabled, are sight impaired and/or come from BME or disadvantaged communities. In addition, siblings, friends and friends of siblings will be included in these play opportunities in the first and second years of the project. After which, projects will be opened up to children and young people in the wider communities. The project will provide training for staff and volunteers, who will in turn, provide training and learning opportunities for parents and carers around the importance and delivery of play.

Adventure Play across the City Project - This project will provide adventurous play opportunities in convenient, local, doorstep play areas in the heart of Derby's housing estates. The project will involve redeveloping 6 existing doorstep play areas in different locations. The play areas will provide opportunities for swinging, climbing, hanging, balancing, crawling, leaping, running and jumping. The play opportunities will provide a wide variety of ways for children to develop their skills and challenge their boundaries. The children will be able to use their communication skills as they negotiate new and challenging play opportunities. The equipment will encourage them to use and develop their imagination, whilst using play equipment designed to stimulate physical, mental and emotional development. They will provide opportunities not currently available to them in the immediate vicinities.
